Editor's Note from Wesley Wicker '79: This is an unusual insert in our twice-yearly newsletter. However, the alumni leadership felt that this was an issue worthy of discussion.

University administrators tell us that the three major issues college students face today include: hazing, alcohol and drug abuse, and depression. The latter often results in suicide or attempted suicide. Last fall, Alpha Phi lost an undergraduate brother who suffered from extreme depression.

No fewer than three Alpha Phi alumni have passed as a result of suicide. I pledged one of those men, and his death haunts me to this day. Did he ever consider reaching out to another brother for help? Could I have helped him? Are we too busy in our daily lives to recognize that someone we know, and care about, is suffering from depression?

Recognizing the challenges facing college students today, the National Fraternity instituted a new office, the Vice President of Health and Safety, in each chapter. Theta Chi also created a new initiative to address the health and safety of our brothers. Known as the Sacred Purpose, the initiative reflects our ideals, "to lend a Helping Hand to all who seek it."

I have no doubt, that among our 2,000 initiated alumni of Alpha Phi, there is a brother looking for your Helping Hand.

Parker's Story

If I were to say the average person would meet upwards of 10,000 people in a lifetime, how many of those people would have something positive to say about you? What if I asked you to put a number on how many of those 10,000 people would even remember you? What would your answer be? I'm no gambling man, but I would bet in the 22 short years of Parker Jordan's life, he had already met 10,000 people. I would also bet, out of those 10,000 people that Parker met, they would all have something positive to say about him. Parker could walk in a room of ten strangers and walk out with ten new friends. How many people do you know that could do that?

The first time I met Parker was the morning of our first sorority bid-day, August 2011. I had recently received my bid to Theta Chi, and hadn't met many of the brothers yet. As I walked in the back gate of the old house, a tall, friendly looking guy approached me and said, "Hey you must be my new pledge brother, my name is Parker and from now on, what's mine is yours." That was the first thing Parker ever told me, and that is exactly the kind of person he was.

Parker possessed a gift that not many people have. He was blessed with the ability to bring people together in laughter. Parker was the kind of guy that didn't care if you were laughing with him or at him, as long as you were laughing. From his loud and obnoxious comments during chapter, to his outrageous outfits and facial hair, during our parties this brother was a hoot!

I will never forget the first time I saw him wearing his onezie pajamas. I was eating breakfast at the house one morning and here comes Parker strolling in wearing an onezie. He looked hilarious in this onezie, and everyone in the dining room started laughing. I didn't even know they made onezie pajamas for a 6' 8" frame, but Parker owned one, because it made us laugh. He was good at making us laugh and that's what he loved.

If you knew Parker, then you knew how kind and loving he was. You could talk to him about anything, and know he would give

you an unbiased honest answer.

Parker was known for his big smiles and big bear hugs. If he caught wind of you having a bad day, I guarantee you would have received both. You need people like Parker in your life.

You need people who will pick you up when you're down, dust off your shoulders, and then make you smile. If I ever needed something, I knew whom to go to. Parker had your back through thick and thin. He was such a kind, selfless friend that could get along with anyone.

Dealing with the death of Parker was something with which I struggle. I just can't wrap my head around the fact that such a happy, loving person in my life is gone. As time passes, I continue to think about him, and what he did for the people in his life. I realize, even though Parker is gone, he still manages to impact us in the same ways he always did. In the days after his death, although sad, our chapter came together and grew stronger as one.

We celebrated the life of Parker Jordan, just like he would have wanted us to do. The stories told about him brought happiness and laughter, just like he would have wanted. A week after his death, the organization Walk out of the Darkness held a Walk for Suicide Awareness. The brothers of Theta Chi came together and raised enough money to double the goal set for the walk. One of our sophomores even convinced Mark Cuban to donate money in honor of Parker. We were asked to lead the walk in memory of Parker, and we did so proudly. Our chapter was brought together as one in the memory of him.

I am so thankful for the opportunity of getting to know Parker. I cherish the impact he had on my life, and all the memories we shared together. He was truly an incredible person, and he will never be forgotten

Like few others, Dewey exemplified the spirit of fun, which inculcated our entire brotherhood with his run-away sense of humor, sense of adventure, desire to connect with all... and his uncanny ability to find levity even amidst the heaviest of situations. Make no mistake about it. He seemed to never fail to put a smile on the faces of all around him. By such example, he reminded each of us to never take ourselves too seriously. Dewey understood that the key to the merry-go-round... is the merry.

I feel fortunate to be a part of the Lichy extended family, because Dr. Pete Lichy was my Theta Chi little brother. My name is Clayton Williams, Chapter President of the Alpha Phi Chapter of Theta Chi Fraternity. This year has been a great year for our chapter. This past fall we initiated forty-eight new brothers. We hosted the Grand Opening of our new chapter house in September with more than 750 people in attendance. The event was a huge success.

The undergraduate brothers have made an effort for increase our philanthropic efforts this year. Last fall, the chapter raised more than \$33,000 for the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, and we participated in a Suicide Awareness Walk. Additionally, we collected the most cans, 1816 pounds, for Beat Auburn Beat Hunger, a food drive that supports the West Alabama Food Bank.

This spring, the chapter will participate in eight philanthropy or community service events, several of which will be hosted at the chapter house to support the USO, Theta Chi's new national philanthropic partner.

Past president Marcus Gibson received the IFC Greek Man of the Year Award at the Greek Excellence Awards Banquet in January. This is a huge honor for both Marcus and Alpha Phi Chapter. It is truly a great time to be a brother our chapter. We would like to thank everyone for supporting us as well as thank those who contributed to our new home.

It has been my honor and pleasure to publish the alumni newsletter. Over the last four years, our alumni have planned, constructed and raised more than \$1 million for our new chapter house. We hosted the largest gathering of Alpha Phi alumni in our chapter's 89-year history last fall. I'm pleased to report that the House Corporation operates the chapter house in the black, with reserve funds in excess of \$250,000. After completing the construction of the house, our Capital Fund continues to receive gifts and pledges that will enable us to continue to pay down the loan, earlier than scheduled, and we have established a Long Term Capital Maintenance Fund with more than \$100,000. I was recently asked by a fellow alumnus, "Was it worth it, getting involved with the alumni and spending all the time on the new chapter?" My answer was simple, "Yes. How about you?"
